

The student contest by Oikonomiki Epitheorisi magazine marks 30th Year

The student contest, a tradition that has been awarding over 450 students for the past 30 consecutive years, is once again renewing its appointment with students from all tertiary education institutions in the country.

Aiming to connect the student community with the business world and to link academic knowledge with current economic issues, the Student Contest is an initiative of the monthly economic-political magazine "Oikonomiki Epitheorisi," one of the longest-running Greek publications, which since 1934 has been capturing and analyzing the most significant economic developments with credibility and reliability.

This year's milestone contest centers around the theme "Artificial Intelligence: Threat or **Opportunity for Humanity?**" It delves into the rapid advancements of Artificial Intelligence and Large Linguistic Models (LLM), their increasingly widespread use in various fields of human activity, and the incomplete awareness of their broader significance, both progressive and disruptive.

Students are encouraged to develop and submit their scientific papers, either individually or in groups, in one of the three thematic sub-sections below:

- 1. Artificial Intelligence and the future of work: How it will affect businesses and employees. 2. Artificial Intelligence as an innovation strategy in science and/or education.
- 3. Artificial Intelligence, human rights and Democracy: Challenges, risks and new horizons.

Papers submission can be made online, through the relevant submission form, while the submission deadline is set for **April 30, 2024**.

Following the submission deadline, a distinguished Evaluation Committee, comprising industry experts from both academia and the business environment, will assess all submissions. The competition will culminate in an Awards Ceremony, scheduled for early June 2024, where the top three (3) group and individual papers will be awarded.
